POSITION DESCRIPTIONS

1. Instructor to teach a speech and debate class for middle and high school students. This is a very part time position, approximately 2:45 to 3:45 p.m., 1 – 2 times per week. Some experience in speech and debate as well as fluency in Spanish are required. Wage range beginning at \$12/hr, depending on experience.
2. Volunteers and an instructor to start up and lead an afterschool Mariachi Band for middle school youth, to meet 1 – 2 times per week, approximately 2:45 - 3:45 p.m. Prior experience with Mariachi music and instruments is required, as well as proficiency in Spanish and English. Wage range beginning at \$12/hr, depending on experience.
3. Elementary homework club attendant, approximately 3:15 to 4:15 p.m., 1 – 4 times per week. Wage \$12 per hour. Proficiency in both Spanish and English, as well as strong educational skills are required.
