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Student Volunteer Positions and Responsibilities

Counselor

Responsibilities include but are not limited to: Committing your time and effort during the week to be a positive role model to children ages K-1st grade. Leading groups of 8-10 children to learn and practice safety concepts thru guest speakers, songs, skits, arts and crafts. Be conscientious about your commitment and plan to be at camp everyday. Smile and have a positive attitude, pay attention, listen and keep track of your group at all times.
